

Thorpe Lea Primary School Pupil Premium Funding Review 2017 - 2018

Pupil Premium Funds are received for every child who qualifies for free school meals currently (FSM pupils) or who has qualified in the past 6 years (Ever6 pupils) and for Looked After Children.

The Pupil Premium Grant is allocated to a school based on the previous January's census. Schools are free to allocate and spend the Pupil Premium Grant in the way they deem most appropriate, however Thorpe Lea Primary School is accountable for ensuring this grant is deployed effectively to progress the learning of eligible pupils.
