LEAVE OF ABSENCE DURING TERM TIME

As parents, you have a legal responsibility to ensure your child's attendance at school. During the academic year, pupils are at school for 190 days and at home for 175 days. Please be aware that The Education (Pupil Registration)(England)(Amendment) Regulations 2013, state that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. The Headteacher is also required to determine the number of school days a child can be away from school if leave is granted. Please complete and submit the form on our website if you wish for the Headteacher to consider your request for your child's leave of absence for exceptional circumstances. We may ask for proof to validate your request. The Headteacher will consider the reasons for the request carefully and you will be notified of the decision. For further information, please refer to our School Attendance Policy.

Unauthorised absence of 5 days or more will result in the following action being taken:

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Nursery

During Summer 1, our topic was 'The Seasons'. Each week, the children explored a different season of the year and discovered how the world around us changes throughout the seasons. The children enjoyed a range of hands-on activities, including sensory trays filled with seasonal resources and exploring natural materials that can be found during each time of year. We talked about the weather, changing colours, plants and animals, and the children loved sharing their own experiences of each season.

One of the highlights of the term was taking part in Thorpefest! Nursery joined Reception to perform 'Wannabe' by the Spice Girls in front of the rest of the school. The children were fantastic performers and thoroughly enjoyed being part of the school festival. They also worked together to create an amazing 90s-themed boom box for our Canstruction competition, showing wonderful teamwork and creativity.



In Summer 2, our topic was 'All Creatures Great and Small'. The children explored a fascinating variety of animals, from enormous dinosaurs to tiny minibeasts. We also learnt about farm animals and family pets, discussing what they need to stay healthy and how we can care for them responsibly. A real highlight of the term was our very first Nursery school trip to ACS Egham. The children had an unforgettable day meeting a variety of farm animals and reptiles. They had the opportunity to hold, stroke and feed many of the animals while learning about how they are cared for. It was wonderful to see the children's confidence grow as they experienced so many new things. Another truly special experience this term was watching our chicken eggs hatch. The children were fascinated as they observed the chicks developing before witnessing the magical moment a chick emerged from its egg. Once the chicks were old enough, the children carefully held them and learnt about the importance of keeping them safe, warm, well-fed and hydrated. This was a memorable experience that sparked many thoughtful conversations and questions.



Reception

Reception – What a Fantastic End to the Year!

The last couple of terms in Reception have been packed with exciting learning, memorable experiences and lots of fun! One of the highlights was our trip to Bocketts Farm, where the children had a wonderful day meeting animals, exploring the farm and learning about life on a working farm. Back in school, we were fascinated by our butterfly project, carefully watching caterpillars transform into beautiful butterflies before releasing them into the wild. The children were also incredibly proud to perform in their class assembly, confidently sharing their learning with parents and the rest of the school.

We have also enjoyed a busy term of sporting and cultural activities. The children showed fantastic enthusiasm and determination during Sports Day, cheering each other on and taking part with huge smiles. In our learning about different countries, we explored England, Spain and Italy, developing our geography skills and discovering what makes each place unique. We loved trying new foods, including delicious Spanish tapas and making our own mini pizzas inspired by Italy!

To top it all off, Reception bravely tackled a summer heatwave! We found lots of fun ways to keep cool, including splashing in the paddling pool and enjoying refreshing ice lollies in the sunshine. It has been a truly fantastic end to the year, and we are so proud of how much the children have grown in confidence, independence and curiosity. We know they are more than ready for their exciting next adventure in Year 1!



Year 1

Perform drama workshop:



Year 1 thoroughly enjoyed taking part in a Perform Drama workshop, where they had the exciting opportunity to meet Peter Pan! Through drama, role-play and imaginative activities, the children explored storytelling, developed characters, and built their confidence in using their creativity and imagination

The children used counters and other resources to help them represent, share and group quantities, building their confidence and deepening their understanding of key mathematical concepts.

The third Thorpe Fest took place in the summer and our song Wonderwall was not just stuck in our heads during the festival time, but it was also recognised after every England football match at the World Cup.



Speaking of, Year 2 spent time every day discussing and learning about the World Cup and how the tournament works. We discussed and learned about countries near and far, and cheered on different teams. These worldwide events are a great at learning geography, culture, sportsmanship and making memories.

Year 3 have also worked hard taking part in the Be Your Best programme, learning how to eat healthy and to look after our bodies every day.

We have also worked hard on our assembly and it was wonderful to watch them share this with their parents.





As we reach the end of an unforgettable year, it is hard to believe just how much Year 4's achieved! From the very beginning, this class has embraced every challenge, celebrated every success, and supported one another through every adventure. It has truly been a year filled with curiosity, creativity, resilience, laughter, and friendship.

Our English journey has taken us from the dramatic cliffs of *The Iron Man*, reflecting with *The Selfish Giant*, collected memories in *The Matchbox Diary* and as far back as the mysteries of *The Story of Tutankhamun*, where we wrote suspenseful narratives, diary entries, newspaper reports, letters of advice, instructional texts, persuasive letters, postcards, character descriptions, and informative pieces. Throughout it all, the children have grown into confident writers who are not afraid to take risks and let their creativity shine.



In Comprehension, we explored how lighthouses work, delved into the powerful messages of *The Undefeated*, followed Stella's icy adventures while travelling with *The Polar Bear Explorers' Club*, and learnt how to retrieve, infer, predict, explain, summarise, and justify our ideas using evidence from the text. Our discussions have been thoughtful, insightful, and often full of excitement as we tried to predict what might happen next.

From place value and rounding to column methods, fractions, decimals, money, time, geometry, statistics, and multiplication and division, the children have shown determination and perseverance.
